YEAR 8 FOOTBALL TOURNAMENT SUCCESS





RESIDENTIAL TRIP IN JUNE/JULY







We are excited to announce that we are provisionally organising a four-day residential trip to Dolgellau, Wales! This adventure will take place either at the end of June or the beginning of July, and we are fortunate to have secured a provisional booking at this extremely popular venue for school groups. Our school will enjoy exclusive use of the facilities, ensuring a unique and tailored experience for our students. To secure this trip, we need at least 30 pupils to sign up, so we encourage you to show your interest by the deadline of 18 November.

Residential courses like this are invaluable to the National Curriculum and align perfectly with our school's vision of fostering personal development and self-esteem. Students will benefit immensely from this educational and social experience, with opportunities to enhance their learning in Geography and Science while enjoying the beauty of the natural surroundings.



This year's program promises to be both enjoyable and worthwhile. It features mini treks, treasure hunts, indoor games, a waterfall trek, a seaside visit, and an optional summit climb to Cader Idris. Additionally, there will be Islamic nasihah sessions designed to uplift students spiritually throughout the trip.

This opportunity is limited to 32 students from Years 7 to 11 on a first-come, first-served basis. It costs only £180, which includes transport, accommodation, and food. Up to six places are also available for parents who wish to accompany their child, at a cost of £140.

To confirm your booking, an initial non-refundable deposit of £40 will be required to secure your child's place. The remaining £140 can be split into three monthly payments of approximately £46.67 each. We look forward to an unforgettable trip filled with learning and adventure!
