**AMS: AID FOR SYRIA PROGRAM** 


Alhamdulillah, Darul Uloom Islamic High School has officially registered for the Aid for Syria program as part of the Association of Muslim Schools (AMS).




## **NASIHAH WITH DR ABDUL MATIN**


